SWINE FLU

There is obviously a lot of media attention being given to this subject at the moment and, during Thursday's assembly, we took the opportunity to remind children of a few basic hygiene rules which we are repeating here -

General infection control practices and good respiratory hand hygiene can help to reduce transmission of all viruses, including the human swine influenza. This includes:

- covering your nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing, using a tissue when possible
- disposing of dirty tissues promptly and carefully
- maintaining good basic hygiene, for example, washing hands frequently with soap and water to reduce the spread of the virus from your hands to face or to other people
- cleaning hard surfaces, such as door handles, frequently using a normal cleaning product
- making sure your children follow this advice!
