SCHOOL CROSSING PATROL

There is still a vacancy for a School Crossing Patrol on Ladybank Road. Please see overleaf for more details.



Your School Crossing Patrol Service, which is part of Regeneration and Community at Derby City Council, provides patrols at various locations throughout the city. Patrols are given comprehensive training after being appointed and supplied with a uniform and winter uniform. Regular supervision is then given and on going training and advice is provided. Annual group training meetings take place giving the patrols an opportunity to meet with other patrols and management to discuss ideas or concerns and be updated on any changes. This contact helps maintain team spirit as most patrols normally work alone.

In January 2001 the law changed allowing patrols to stop traffic for adults as well as children so they now provide a service for all pedestrians.

Rule 87 of the Highway Code states Motorists must stop when instructed to do so by a School Crossing Patrol or face possible penalties of

- A fine of up to £1000
- 3 Penalty point
- Disqualification

As valuable members of the community our School Crossing Patrols do a vital job in seeing pedestrians safely across the road. For children this is at the most vulnerable part of their journey. Patrols turn out in all weather, with a cheerful smile on their faces and a friendly wave to passers by.

Would you like to become a School Crossing Patrol?

You must be physically fit and have the ability to read and understand written and verbal health and safety instructions in English.

A winter and summer uniform and full training will be provided.

You will only need to work during term time: morning and afternoons.

Payment will be made throughout all school holidays.

At an hourly rate of £5.90

Age range 18 upwards (to beyond 70 years)

Criminal Records Bureau and medical checks undertaken.
